

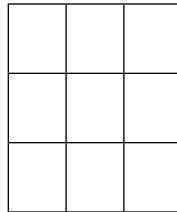


Spanish for You!
Simple. Effective. Affordable

Bingo or Picture Bingo - you need 2 or more players

Materials: paper, pencil, vocabulary picture cards (optional)

Make a 9, 16 or 25 square Bingo card on a piece of paper. Remember that you will have the same number of columns as rows. For example, a 9-square card will look like this:



- Write one Spanish vocabulary word in English in each square. Each square should have a different word.
- Write the Spanish words for your vocabulary words on small pieces of paper and put them in a bag or bowl.
- Take turns drawing out a paper and reading it aloud.
- Put a bingo chip on the square that matches the word drawn.
- The first person to get one row across, down or diagonal wins.
- For more challenge draw pictures in the Bingo card squares. Write the Spanish words on the papers to be drawn from the bag or bowl. This way you only use Spanish!
- If you're using Spanish for You!, you can print the flashcard/activity pictures to put into the shape of a Bingo card.
- ****If you are using this game in a class when you are first introducing new vocabulary, then leave flashcards of the vocabulary on the wall for students to look at for help. Or allow them to keep their books open.**
- **Variation:** If you are using Spanish for You!, print your vocabulary picture cards, one set per player, plus an extra set to call the words. Players cut out their squares and form them into the shape of a Bingo card. Use the extra set of pictures to put in a bag and take turns picking one and calling it out.
