

Spanish for You! Assessments

There are many ways you can assess students using Spanish for You! Here we provide you with a list of assessment materials included in your curriculum as well as additional assessment possibilities:

- **End of program tests.** Every package comes with an end of program test that concisely combines all the concepts learned in the 5 units (called Lecciones in the book). The tests are included in the PDF download folder containing all the worksheets.
- **Blast from the Past Worksheets.** These are one-page worksheets found on our Curriculum Activities for You! page which curriculum users can access. These worksheets can be used to either go back at any time after completing a themed package for a concise and comprehensive review of each unit, OR teachers can use them as end of unit assessments.
- **Self-checking worksheets.** These are practice for students, however, teachers can score and grade them.
- **Dialogs and Storyboards.** These are FREE extra items found on our Curriculum Activities for You! page. You can use these as assignments to grade according to any rubric you choose.
- **Assess any of the multi-sensory practice activities** assigned to students throughout the program.
 - For example, when students are learning new vocabulary, they do different "listen and write" or "listen and respond" practice activities in the Using Your New Vocabulary section of a unit. These activities could easily be used later for assessing their knowledge of vocabulary, ability to spell words correctly, ability to say and pronounce correctly, etc.
 - Another example: In the Interactive Use of Verbs section of each unit, students ask and answer questions for practice. This could easily be used by the teacher to assess their ability to use verbs in context with proper conjugation. The teacher would just need to create a simple rubric by which to grade the student.

The possibilities are endless, but simple. Just pull any activity students do as practice and create a simple rubric to score/grade.
